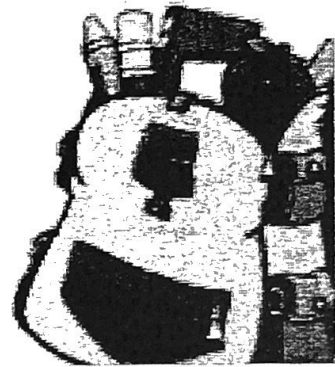
PS 106 PARKCHESTER 2023-2024 5th GRADE SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST

and open to ANY NYC student. Students will write book reviews, log the books that they are reading on a book log, and create daily reading goals. Visit your local Public Library for more information.

2. Get a composition or spiral notebook to record your thoughts! When you finish each book or section in each book, write a journal entry about the book in which you address questions like:

- What are some parts in the book that remind you of something that has happened to you?
- What books can you remember that remind you of the book you just read?
- What I read makes me think about . . .
- I was surprised that . . .
- I wonder why the author . . .
- I really want to know . . .
- The part I like best is ____ because . . .
- This selection makes me feel . . .
- I wish the author had . . .
- I predict that . . .
- The setting reminds me of . . .
